Directions for Halloween Project Book

Symbols: Cut out the plaques. On each plaque, write the origin of that symbol and/or why it is associated with Halloween. There is a page of blank plaques in case you want to add to them, or use your own symbols. The plaques can be stapled together on the side, hole punched & held with a brass fastener, or glued individually on the file folder.

Traditions: Cut out the pages for the mini book. On each page write where the tradition came from. Staple them on the top or the side. Glue back of bottom page to file folder.

Haunted House: Cut out and fold on middle line, so the picture faces out. On the inside, write what type of things are found in a haunted house; if you have ever been to a haunted house; whether or not you like haunted houses and why. Color the front of the house. Glue back to file folder.

How I Celebrate: Cut out the pages for mini book. On each page fill in information about how you and your family celebrate Halloween. One blank page has been added in case you have anything else to add. Staple book together at top. Pages should go in this order - cover on top, My Favorite Costumes, Foods, Traditions, Blank Page (if used) on bottom. Glue back of bottom page to file folder.

Other Countries: Cut out the pages. On each page write about how Halloween is celebrated in another country. Use a different page for each country. There is an additional sheet of blank pages for Other Countries in case you want to add more. Staple together or hole punch and secure with a brass fastener.

Superstitions: Cut out the pages. On each page, write about a different superstition that people believe in. You can also add if you believe it or not, and why. Staple together on the side.

Games: There are boards for two games, Halloween-O and Halloween Words. Both of these are played like BINGO. Cut out the boards (there are 4 boards for each game). Give each player something to mark their squares with (beans, counters, coins, etc.). Call out the letters or words in random order. The first person to get 3 squares in a row wins. A sheet with blank game boards (2 of each) is included.

Cut out the Game Board Envelopes, on the solid lines. Fold on the dotted lines. Glue to the file folder to store the game boards.

Some recipe cards have been included. One is blank & you can print it out to use for your own recipes. The others have recipes on them. These are easy to make & may be a fun addition to your study. If you choose to put them in your Project Book, a regular, small envelope should hold them. Cut off the envelope flap, write **Recipes** on the back, and glue the front of the envelope to the file folder.

There is also a page of suggested resources. You do not have to use these resources, but you may find them helpful. Please remember that any and all resources should be used at the discretion of you (the parent or teacher). Only you can decide what is or is not appropriate for your child(ren) or students.

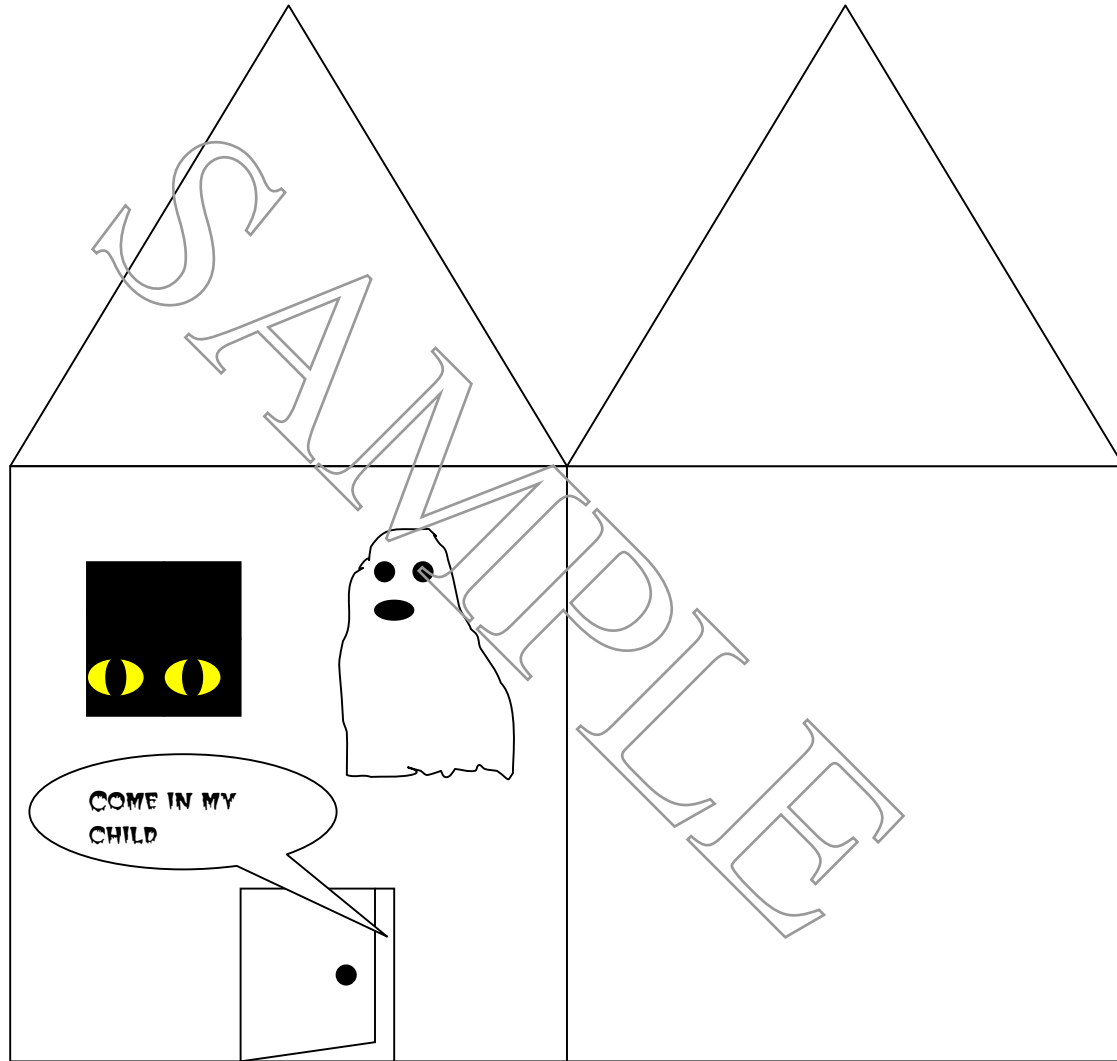
